## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Are you tired of praying? Why or why not?
- 2. Read 2 Corinthians 12:6-10.
  - a. How do you pray when you can't catch a break? (like Paul, Joseph Scriven, Horatio Spafford)
  - b. Have you ever considered something a "thorn in your flesh" that was/is a weakness by which the power of Christ can work through you? Please explain.
- 3. What does it mean for Jesus to 'know our every weakness', as the song says? (see also <u>Hebrews 4:15-16</u>, <u>Matthew 26:39</u>)
- 4. How is prayer a conversation with God? What would prayer look like if it was not a conversation?
- **5.** Read <u>Hebrews 11:6</u> and <u>Psalm 34:1</u>. Milton said, "we pray to understand God's character." What does that mean to you?
- **6.** Do you agree that when you spend enough time with someone, you start acting like them? Give an example where you have seen this play out. Is this true about spending time with Jesus? (See <a href="Philippians 3:10">Philippians 3:10</a>)
